DIRECTIVES FOR PUBLIC MASSES AT ST. PHILIP

- + The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains dispensed.
- + Signs are posted on the pews to promote social distancing.
- + Missals can be picked up on your way in to church and returned after Mass.
- + Place your offertory money in the basket as you enter church.
- + Communion will be distributed to the right side of church followed by the left. Please observe 6 foot distancing.
- + Frequently touched surfaces in church will be sanitized after every Mass.
- + Congregational singing is discouraged to help prevent spread of virus.
- + Masks are required.

DO YOU HAVE A 3-6 YEAR OLD CHILD OR GRANDCHILD? St. Philip is now offering Catechesis of the Good Shepherd this fall, which is a Montessori-based Catholic faith formation program where children can grow in their relationship with

God through a deep engagement in Scripture and liturgy. Our work as adults is to provide a place for the child and a specially prepared room (the Atrium) where children can come to know Jesus, the Good Shepherd. It is prepared with materials that children work with as a way of meditating upon the essentials of our faith found in Scripture and in liturgy. Examples of materials found in the **Atrium** include small clay figures of Jesus and the disciples used to meditate on the Last Supper; detailed interactive maps of the Land of Israel and the City of Jerusalem to help situate Jesus as a real person in time; Jerusalem Mustard seeds and beautiful pearls to help ponder the Parables of the Kingdom of God; and a small Baptismal font and Paschal candle used to explore the significance of Baptism. **Class times** will depend upon the number of children enrolled.
