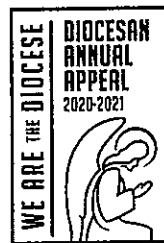

DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC, the Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful will be extended throughout the entire month of November, with changes for works and conditions to ensure safety:

- + The Plenary Indulgences for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased, even if only mentally, normally on Nov. 1-8, may be transferred to any other day of the month of November.
- + The Plenary Indulgence for Nov. 2, for those who visit a church and recite the Our Father and the Creed there, may be transferred to any day of Nov.
- + The elderly, sick and all who for serious reasons cannot leave their homes will be able to obtain a Plenary Indulgence if they join spiritually with all the faithful, detached from sin, and intend to comply as soon as possible with the usual conditions: Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, prayer for the Holy Father's intentions and recite prayer for the deceased.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES – November 5, 2020

Present: Father Janusz, Rich Larsen, Craig & Sara Smits, Barb Ziebell, Becky Engstrand, Jim Janz, Carl Laska, Leslie Kozicki, Carol & Joe Haupt, Keith Wirtz, Kathy Hamus, Linda Hobbs, Kris Willfahrt, Kathy TerMaat

Going forward, Finance and Pastoral Councils will meet on separate days.

Friends of St. Philip Youth: Sara Smits explained what this group does including Rummage Sale, Christmas Cookie Sale, Christmas Cookie Plates, CERA Park Picnic, Education Grants for 8th Graders, Leaf Raking, Bus Trips to Ballgames and Shrines, Movie Night, Bingo, Gift of Bibles for Confirmation students. Recently cards and gift cards were distributed to those in the parish and community in need of a kind word and/or gift. Father would like to see education in the faith be part of this group's efforts.

Parish Picnic: Kathy reported that \$19,000 was collected from parishioners since we couldn't have a picnic. We are grateful for everyone's generosity.

Grotto: Leslie Kozicki, bookkeeper, reported that speakers in cave were replaced thanks to donors and the PCCW. Other expenses included tree removal from storm damage and lawn mower repair. Because of COVID, no buses visited this summer. Relevant Radio will not accept advertising next year. Father suggested looking into free public TV advertising.

Buildings & Grounds: Projects were covered at the Finance Meeting...school memorial, church basement water project, church basement bathroom update, church window repair, rectory kitchen renovation, parking lot improvement, first floor rectory windows replacement.

Liturgy: Linda talked about the new hard cover books that we will begin using the first Sunday of Advent. They include all three liturgical year readings.

We will have an Advent Penance

Service in December with 3-4 priests.

Deanery: Barb said they are looking to replace Bob Hunn who recently passed away.

Cemetery: The new entrance has been completed. Father observed that some of the headstones are leaning. This is responsibility of families. In the future, Father would like to see a map of names and location of graves. Becky Engstrand asked if a couple benches could be placed in the cemetery so people could sit and pray when they visit.

ACS Commission: Craig Smits reported that they meet once a month. Zaleski Sports and Wisconsin River Orthopaedics are airing AHS sports. In person attendance is limited because of COVID. The Royal Event Fundraiser was cancelled. Auction Royale is scheduled for March 2021. Enrollment is about the same as last year K-12 – 390 students. They are doing a fine job keeping everyone healthy...wearing masks, sanitizing and keeping students in their pod

groups. Class times are longer but held on alternating days. On November 6, the system marked 50 consecutive days of in-person learning. The accreditation process will be in 2021. This is required for the School Choice Program.

CCD: Keith reported that they are having in person classes with masks and distancing. There are fewer students because of Holy Rosary having their own program.

Father Janusz said all parishioners will be receiving a book by Matthew Kelly in December.
