### Parish Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes - November 2, 2023

Present: Father Janusz, Kathy Hamus, Carol and Joe Haupt, Joni Kelnhofer, Rich Larsen, Craig and Sara Smits, Keith Wirtz, Barb Ziebell

Father Janusz opened the meeting with a prayer.

Ron Adamski presented a final architectural drawing of the addition of the new bathrooms. The three windows that face south will be moved and will face the parking lot. There is an option to include three windows on the south. This could mean occasion for a family to donate a window. These windows would face Second Street North.

A new sewer line will be brought to the addition with no overhead sewer line. The sewer line will be 3 to 4 feet down, will be insulated, and will run along side of the church. Water will have to be brought overhead in the basement.

Since sub-contractors have to be confirmed, so should the work begin now where it will run through the Christmas season, or wait until next year? A decision was made to wait until next year to begin construction.

The total amount for this project is \$189,877. Our church goal of the Inspired By The Spirit campaign was \$190,000. With 82 families contributing to the campaign, \$267,120 is pledged. If all pledges are met, the church will receive \$185,000. A percentage of the Inspired By The Spirit Campaign goes to our 2022-2023 Diocesan Annual Appeal, Holy Cross Center and the Catholic Foundation.

To date, we have \$69,969 in the Inspired By the Spirit account; \$32,113 in a Major Projects (We Belong To Christ) Account; \$106,232 in a General Savings Account, for a total of \$208,404 that is available for this project.

There are three alternatives in addition to the bathroom addition:

- #1 A temporary chain link fence or snow fence should be erected around the project to prevent anyone from falling into the hole. A decision was made to go with the chain link fence.
- #2 In the basement bathrooms, tile is half way up the wall. It will cost an additional \$2,851 if the tile covers the entire wall in the new bathrooms. It was decided to have the tile cover the entire wall.
- #3 Electrical upgrading will cost of \$9,500. For safety and convenience, everything should be updated at this time. Father Janusz suggested that we begin the electrical work asap. There was unanimous agreement.

Ron was thanked for his presentation and willingness to work on the project for our parish.

Meeting continued with committee reports:

<u>Keith Wirtz – PPC</u> meetings should be held on a regular basis so that the parishioners know what is happening.

<u>Sara Smits - St Philip Youth</u> – This group is involved in many projects: rummage sale, cemetery clean up, Brewers trip, Family Movie night, and Country Christmas. Next summer they are considering a Rafters game and/or an outing at Cera Park or an aquatic park.

<u>Craig Smits – ASC (Assumption Catholic Schools)</u> – Looking for an Advancement Director and a Controller. Cranberry Classic Tournament will celebrate its 39<sup>th</sup> year.

<u>Christy Steinle (by Rich Larsen) – ASC Finance</u> – Thanks to the Voucher System, more money has come to Assumption. They will ascertain if it is possible to reduce assessments to parishes. There has been an increase in enrollment from pre-covid 390 to a current enrollment of 440. St. Phillip's subsidy decreased 3% this academic year.

<u>Joni Kelnhofer PCCW</u> – This group donates to many causes, assists with funerals, provides volunteer help with the Welcome Center, provides little books for Advent and Lent. Joni just wishes she could encourage more ladies to attend the meetings.

<u>Rich Larsen</u> – Attendance at Mass seems to be increasing. Young families are returning. Someone asked him about cremated remains being interred in the cemetery on Fifth Avenue. Also, he asked about the registered name of this cemetery. Rich was advised to talk to John Van Asten.

<u>Barb Ziebell – Deanery Rep</u> – Is treasurer of the Deanery as well as the rep for our parish. Committee has not met since covid.

<u>Joe Haupt – Maintenance</u> – There is a new front door and frame work on the Rectory entrance. A wall was removed in a room in the Education Center, which opened up the room. Next Spring the deck on the back side of the Rectory will be replaced. After the construction of the bathrooms, the parking lot will be overhauled. It will cost approximately \$100,000 to do the project correctly.

Father Janusz has talked to Howie Nigon about remodeling the Sacristy. There is no place to sit and the closets are filled with items that are rarely used. The items that will be removed from the closets and will be stored in the attic

When no one is living in the Rectory, the building janitor should be informed that the building has to be checked daily during the winter months to be certain that the water does not freeze and to check the temperature of the rooms.

Father Janusz closed the meeting at 7:04 p.m. with a prayer.
