Minutes of St. Philip Parish Council Minutes - April 4, 2024

Present: <u>Father Janusz</u>, Carol Haupt, Joe Haupt, Linda Hobbs, Joan Kelnhofer, Nellile Larsen, Rich Larsen, Sara Smits, Keith Wirtz, Barb Ziebell

At 6:00 p.m., Father Janusz opened the meeting with a prayer.

<u>Sacristy</u> – With the remodeling of the church for new bathrooms, the electric code was found to be in need of upgrading. With this work, there will be only two switches to turn on and off the church lights. The choir loft lights are operated from that location. One of the doors for the sacristy should be an egress door. This will be reviewed.

Rectory Update – The upstairs walls need painting and the carpet needs to be removed. There are hardwood floors underneath the carpet. Perhaps new carpeting won't be needed. A proposal was made to purchase a portable tv with a dvd player.

<u>Security Cameras</u> – Through Solarus, there will be several security cameras installed on parish property – by the Welcome Center, on the outside of church facing the parking lot, and one inside at the main entrance. An individual has agreed to cover the estimated cost (\$6,000 to \$7,000) of this project. The camera's records will be accessed through the church computer and will cover a two week period.

<u>Parish Council Election</u> – In June, there will be an election of new parish council members. Father will announce this from the pulpit and there will be instructions in the Bulletin about volunteering. Chairpersons of church organizations, ie., PCCW, Men and Women Foresters, St. Phiip Youth/Church, etc will be invited to present their group's activities at the beginning of the PPC meeting. They can stay for the entire PPC meeting if they desire.

<u>Committee Reports</u> – PCCW – Thanks to Terry Moscinski, who organized the St. Monica Group event, they raised over \$1,000 with their recent basket raffle and bake sale. Next meeting date is April 10.

<u>St. Philip Youth/Parish Group</u> – Planning a Rafters game this summer and an event at the Aquatic Center. They have given contributions to students going to Rome; to Assumption Band; Family Center; Food Pantry; First Choice Pregnancy; and they will clean up the cemetery for Memorial Day.

REP (Religious Education Program) – There were five boys in the Confirmation class.

Building and Grounds - Only one person on this committee.

<u>Financial Report</u> – Our biggest bill at the moment is insurance (\$7,173) which is up \$11 from last year. In the Inspired By The Spirit Fund - \$80,300; St Philip major project fund - \$44,028; General account - \$108,015; Parking Lot Fund - \$24, 986 (this money has been raised through COF breakfasts). Bulletin ads generate \$6,000 per year.

At 6:53 p.m., Father Janusz closed the meeting with a prayer.
